The learning and teaching program at Kilbreda College is both dynamic and innovative, catering for the students' spiritual, academic, social, emotional and physical development. Students are challenged to be creative, critical and reflective thinkers and to develop a broad and transferable skill set. Opportunities for both independent and collaborative learning are provided and contemporary technologies are integrated throughout the learning and teaching program.

At the College, Visual Arts are valued as expressive, creative and communicative experiences that engage students in critical and creative thinking. We strive to inspire and nurture a love of learning in our students by providing specialist guidance in drawing, painting, ceramics, mixed media, printmaking, photography, visual communication and design and media studies.

Visual Arts studies engage students in a variety of forms, technologies and processes. Students' learning encompasses cognitive, emotional, sensory, aesthetic and kinaesthetic dimensions.

The Visual Arts curriculum encourages students to not only improve their skills in specialist areas, but to also become risk takers and critical thinkers, that strive for excellence.

Studies in this Learning Area provides a wide variety of opportunities to learn beyond the classroom with excursions to many galleries and exhibitions. Creative thinking requires looking at problems or situations with a fresh perspective. Being provided this extension of learning and allowing students to see artwork in person, assists them with developing their individual styles and aides in processing their own conceptual ideas.
